3 destinations out of London

1. Salisbury

It's a medieval town, the principal attraction is the *Salisbury Cathedral* that host one of the four original copies of the *Magna Carta Libertatum*, a charter of rights agreed to by King John (Lackland) of England. The spire is the tallest of England (123m). Other attraction is the Cathedral close. You can reach Salisbury taking the direct train from Waterloo Station (1h 30 min.) or taking buses from Victoria Coach Station.



2. York

It is a historic walled city in the North Yorkshire. The main attraction is the *York Minster*, one of the largest cathedral in Northern Europe. In the city you can find the *National Railway Museum*, that tells the story of rail transport, and the *Jorvik Viking Centre* a museum that contains lifelike mannequins. The name is derived from "Jórvík" the Old Norse name of York.

To reach York you can take the train at King's Cross (2h).



3. Cambridge

It's a university city. The name derived from the river that cross the city, River Cam.

You can admire the Cambridge University Botanic Garden and the Mathematical Bridge. From Silver St to Sidgwick St. you can find the University buildings: Newham Collage, Selwin College, Cambridge University and King's College.

Walking around you can see the replica of the Bridge of Sights. You can reach Cambridge by train from King's Cross (1h).
